

Plowing Procedures During any significant snowfall the goal of the Township road crew is to clear or remove all snow from the roadways in order to provide all motorists safe and passable roadways. All main thoroughfares are priority with the secondary roads being the last to be cleared. While every effort is made to accommodate all Twp. residents, there may be a delay in plowing services for some secondary areas which includes developments. Vehicles parked on the roads may prohibit the plows operating as effectively as the crew would like. Understanding and cooperation is the key to success during this period of time. Property owners are encouraged to adhere to state guidelines when plowing/ shoveling ice and/or snow off driveways that lie adjacent to state and township roadways.

Reminder - Please DO NOT PARK vehicles ON STREET during a snowstorm

WHY?

- * If you park in your driveway there will be less snow for you to shovel and it is a great help to the road crew.
- * When the plow trucks navigate around parked vehicles the snow plow unloads at your vehicle.
- * If the plow truck damages your vehicle the township is not responsible for repairs as per State law.
- * Road crews can clear roadways better, so after the storm you will be able to park on the street.
- * Piles left on the street tend to freeze solid and could become a bigger possibility of causing damage to your property and township equipment.

DO NOT PARK on SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES, violators WILL be towed at owner's expense.

Mailboxes Every attempt is made to avoid damaging mailboxes, however, we must focus on the goal of clearing township streets for the traveling public. Make sure your mailbox post is strong and able to withstand snow hitting the post as it is being discharged from the plow. Mailboxes that are too close to the road or are mounted on poor supports are sometimes toppled. We suggest checking your mailbox; make sure it is firmly attached to the post. Mailboxes are considered a structure in the township right-of-way. All drivers are instructed to drive as slow as realistically possible during wet snows to minimize problems with mailboxes. Wet,

heavy snow increases the possibility of mailbox and post damage from plowing operations.

Residents should consider placing a protective shield around their mailbox to help block the force of the snow from damaging their mailbox.

Mailboxes knocked down are the responsibility of the resident.



ELIMINATE snow piles at driveway entrances whenever possible. High accumulations of snow obstruct the vision of motorists. **DO NOT** push ice/snow out onto roads at any time. This creates hazardous driving conditions for all vehicles. Please be advised, the result of this activity will be a citation issued from the NLT police, as it is a violation of Ordinance #1-1999.

<u>Nets</u> During the snowplowing season any sports equipment (net, hoop, or backboard) within the Township right-of-way should be removed. Any damage inflicted by Township vehicles during this season will be the sole responsibility of the property owner.

Please help to clear snow and ice from fire hydrants and storm drains.

Snow Emergency Route The following are designated as snow emergency routes. During times of snow and/or ice emergencies, parking shall be prohibited on the cul-de-sac portion of the following streets:

Medical Routines



Communication with the Township office regarding regular medical routines is extremely important during the winter season. Residents with any health issues which frequent visits, daily trips to/from require medical facilities or medical home deliveries should be communicated to the Township Office in writing as soon as possible.

The following information is required:

Name, address, phone number, and a brief description of the routine medical schedule and days services are needed.

This will enable the crews to be informed of priority situations so when there is a significant snow fall (6 inches or more) the road crew will make these areas a priority (this does not mean road crews will be at these residences first, but as soon as possible) during the winter season.

POLICE DEPARTMENT **SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES**

The North Lebanon Township Board of Supervisors have adopted an ordinance declaring certain streets in the Township to posted as SNOW EMERGENCY be ROUTES throughout the Township.

Chapter 15, Section 111 (Ordinance No. 2-2014) states:

After any snow emergency has been declared it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person to: Park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route.

STORM DRAINS & FIRE HYDRANTS

Winter maintenance of storm drains & fire hydrants is important. Grates & Hydrants must be cleared of debris including leaves, ice, and snow. We kindly ask property owners to assist the Highway Dept. & Fire Depts. by clearing any drains & hydrants that are blocked.

Recycling Award

On Tuesday, Sept. 13, 2022, at the Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority's regular board meeting held in conjunction with the Electronics Recycling Facility Dedication, municipalities were presented with a Municipal Recycling Award for outstanding achievements in 2021.

1st Place—West Lebanon Township has the highest municipal recycling rate of 78%

2nd Place—North Lebanon Township has a municipal recycling rate of 72%

3rd Place—Jonestown Borough has a municipal recycling rate of 54%

Battery Recycling Program

Beginning Oct. 1, 2022 the GLRA will accept all rechargeable and single-use batteries for FREE.

Rechargeable batteries are commonly found in cordless power tools, cordless phones, laptops, cellphones, cameras, two-way radios, and medical equipment.

Single-use batteries cannot be recharged and must be disposed of once they wear out. Examples of single-use batteries are flashlights, clocks, remote controls, smoke detectors, toys, and hearing aids.

Each battery must be under 11 pounds and MUST BE placed in an INDIVIDUAL clear plastic storage ziplock bag.

Remember ONLY ONE battery per bag.

Plastic bags are available for residents at the battery recycling station.

Christmas Tree Drop-Off

The Township will again provide an area for **live undecorated** Christmas trees. <u>This is for trees</u> <u>only</u>. Please do not box or bag the tree.



Drop off will be permitted from **December 26, 2022 through February 18, 2023**. The drop-off area is marked and located outside the yard waste facility gate.

A Notice from the Police Department

STORMWATER FEES

The stormwater fee for 2023 will be reduced slightly to a **\$40.00 flat fee per ERU** (equivalent residential unit). The Annual Stormwater Fee bills for single family residents (SFRs) will be mailed out the beginning of January. Quarterly bills for the non-SFRs will be sent according to the follow the schedule:

1st Quarter—beginning of January 3rd Quarter—beginning of July

2nd Quarter—beginning of April 4th Quarter—beginning of October

All bills are due within thirty (30) days as noted on the bill. A ten percent (10%) penalty will be added after the due date on all unpaid accounts. A second notice reflecting the ten percent penalty will be sent to the property owner.

Failure to pay the second notice within the stated timeframe will result in a FINAL administrative letter being sent for all accounts carrying a balance, which will include a twenty dollar (\$20) administrative fee.

If payment is not made by the date stated on the final administrative letter, all unpaid accounts will be turned over to the Township Solicitor for collection and additional fees will be incurred by the property owner. Additional fees could total more than four hundred dollars (\$400).

LIFE SAVING AWARD

Officer Hilbert was on vacation and noticed an unconscious male. He determined the gentleman was having a heart attack. Officer Hilbert provided CPR and was able to resuscitate the man. The man wanted to go back to his hotel room, but on the insistence of Office Hilbert he agreed to go to the hospital in the ambulance. The victim had a second heart attack in the ambulance and a major heart attack while in the hospital.

Officer Hilbert learned from the gentleman's family that he survived. Thanks to Officer Hilbert's quick response and training in providing CPR and insisting the man get into the ambulance, the gentleman survived.

YARDWASTE RENEWAL 2023

Effective January 1st all yard waste cards will be deactivated and are subject to renewal for the new year. Feel free to stop by the office (after January 1st) to complete the paperwork and renew your card. The residential fee for 2023 has been set at \$50 for the year, due to the rising fuel costs.

SUMP PUMPS

During heavy rain events our sewer pumping stations see a spike in flows. We now have video equipment which allows us to inspect our lines and enables us to see where the extra flows are coming from. Please be advised that sump pump connections into the sewer lateral that services your residence **is illegal**. The City of Lebanon Authority is starting to "crack down" on this type of illegal discharge into the sewer system and is recommending all contributing municipalities do the same.

SEWER BILLING DATES ARE AS FOLLOWS: February 10 ~ May 10 ~ August 10 ~ November 10

If you do not receive a bill by the end of these months, please call 717-273-7132 for your total. We CANNOT waive late fees.

When writing out checks, please consider <u>printing</u> everything except your signature. Banking institutions may not accept illegible writing. Also, please verify the amount written (ex. Thirty-Five Dollars and 00/100) matches the cash number (ex. \$35.00) on the check and the check is signed. Any of these situations may cause the bank to return your check as "unprocessed", thus your account will be shown as unpaid and may incur late charges.

ACH transactions <u>through your bank</u> does not mean the amount you designate for your sewer payment is automatically sent to your sewer account. The bank deducts the amount from your bank account, then the bank prints out a paper check and mails it to the Township via the United States Postal Service. Your account only gets credited once we receive the check from your bank. If you use this process the Township recommends having your sewer payment deducted from your account at least seven to ten business days prior to the due date. If the check arrives in the Township office after 4 pm on the due date, it will be considered late and your sewer account will be charged the late fee.

Consider paying your sewer bill online. If you use the online customer portal, your account is automatically credited the same day, whether you pay with a credit card or an e-check. Please be aware that if you pay your bill online <u>after the due date</u> (midnight of the 10th), the late charges will still be applied even though it may not yet be reflected on the customer portal.

The Township Office <u>ONLY</u> ACCEPTS Cash, Check or Money orders. <u>NO DEBIT OR CREDIT</u> <u>CARDS</u> The Township and the Police Dept. both provide a 24 hr. exterior drop box.
