# Spring Clean Up will be the week of April 17, 2023

All items MUST be curbside by April 17th at 6:00 a.m. Only <u>ONE</u> collection sweep of the Township will be made (There will be NO return trips)

Spring clean up is only for the collection of BRANCHES, STICKS and TWIGS. Only these items will be collected.

- All branches must be cut to 6 foot in length or smaller and be less than 6 inches in diameter
- Place in neat 6 foot to 8 foot long piles along the curb, please place piles parallel to curb
- Piles may be as high as 4 feet
- Any items placed in open barrels or bins will be collected and the receptacles will be left on the curb (Please note that small containers are more easily dumped as well as containers which are not packed tightly.)

Please **DO NOT include** root systems or sod of any kind.

#### Any unacceptable items will be left on the property and will be the owners' responsibility to discard.

Please keep piles away from obstructions such as poles, mailboxes, cars, etc. The Yard waste facility is available for those who miss the collection.

To purchase a <u>Yard Waste Access Card</u>, stop by the Township Office any time during our regular office hours. The fee is \$50 and is valid for the calendar year.

<u>Address Signs</u> are available for ordering at the Township. The cost is \$20 per sign. Stop by the Township Office to obtain a copy of the order form. Payment is due at time of ordering.

The Township and the Police Dept. both have 24 hour exterior drop off boxes for your convenience. They are located outside the main doors to the Twp and the Police Dept.

## **On-Lot Sewage Management Program**

The North Lebanon Township Sewage Management Ordinance requires that every property owner who has an onlot sewage disposal system have their treatment/septic tank(s) pumped once every three (3) years within the year the municipality is due. North Lebanon Township is due again in 2023. This program is enforced through the Township Office. Please mail all report forms to North Lebanon Township and make all checks payable to **North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority.** You can find frequently asked questions and some of our forms on our website at *www.northlebanontwppa.gov*.

 $\rightarrow$  Notices will be sent out the first week of April to all North Lebanon Township residents with on-lot sewage disposal systems.

 $\rightarrow$  You will have approximately 5 months for compliance with a **due date of August 31**<sup>st</sup>.

 $\rightarrow$  You <u>must use</u> a registered pumper/hauler from the list you receive with the mailing.

 $\rightarrow$  Currently, there is a thirty dollar (\$30) administrative fee per lot, payable to **North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority.** 

 $\rightarrow$  Anyone who believes they may be eligible for an exemption from the assigned pumping cycle must request an exemption form from the North Lebanon Township Office. You must complete the form, and submit it to the Township along with the appropriate documentation to support your request. Please note that you will only be exempt from pumping your tank, the fee is still required.

#### Ways to Qualify for an Exemption from the Current Pumping Cycle

1. Have a qualified inspector evaluate the depth of the solids and scum in the tank. If the total depth of both solids and scum is less than 1/3 full, you would qualify for an exemption. The proper paperwork and fee must accompany this request.

2. If you had your tank pumped within the last year, you can submit the report form and the fee and we will accept that pumping.

3. If you had your sewage system newly built or repaired <u>within the last year</u> you may qualify for an exemption. You must submit a copy of the approved sewage permit and final inspection along with the exemption request form and the administration fee. We will review the request and determine if the type of repair qualifies for an exemption.

## Sewer Billing Due Dates

Bills go out on the 10th of February, May, August and November. The due date is always 30 days after the bill date. Bills are due on March 10<sup>th</sup>, June 10<sup>th</sup>, September 10<sup>th</sup> and December 10<sup>th</sup>.

You should have already received your February sewer bill in the mail. **The due date is Friday, March 10<sup>th</sup>.** If you are paying in person you will need to be in our office by 4:00 pm on March 10<sup>th</sup>. Please note that your check must be in a cashable state (i.e. check must be signed, filled in correctly, and there must be sufficient funds in the account.) If any of these things are not correct, the penalty process will begin. You may also pay your bill online using the sewer payment portal located on our website's home page (www.northlebanontwppa.gov). Any payments made online must be paid by midnight on March 10<sup>th</sup> to be considered "on time".

Any incorrect deliveries of sewer bills is the responsibility of the Postal Service, not the Township. This also applies to undeliverable bills. If you haven't received your bill a few days after the mailing date (listed above), we suggest you call the Township Office (717-273-7132) for your balance to avoid any late charges or penalties. The staff is always willing to provide you any information you may need. It is the policy of the North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority to NOT waive penalties or late charges. Please be sure your payment is in our office by the close of business on the due date to avoid late charges and penalties.

You can also choose to have your sewer bill delivered via e-mail rather than through the Postal Service. If you would like to implement this free service, please contact Molly at the Township Office.

## **MOWING and STORM WATER MANAGEMENT**

Township ordinances prohibit the disposing of grass clippings in nearby storm water inlets, swales and basins. <u>Also prohibited is blowing grass into the street.</u> Grass that is blown into the street ultimately ends up in the storm sewers and pollutes our creeks and rivers. **Any such activity is a violation of township ordinances and subject to fines and penalties.** 



This is why you should NOT blow grass into the street. It blocks the storm water from flowing into the basin which during storm events causes major flooding.





Do your part by reporting any spills, illicit discharges, or suspicious dumping into storm drains to your local municipality.

## Windy Days & Your Garbage

When the winds blow, most times so does your garbage and/or recycling containers. Per NLT Solid Waste Ordinance, "It shall be the responsibility of the owner or lessee of the real estate to keep all garbage, refuse, or other materials at all times within the receptacle, and such owner/lessee shall immediately clean up any such items that are outside the receptacles." Keep lids on tight and secure. Weigh them down if necessary. Garbage and recycling is your

responsibility until it is collected by your hauler. Please do not litter by leaving items blow into the street or onto neighboring properties!



## Earth Day is April 22nd — Stormwater Management and Recycling

Earth Day is a great time to learn about recycling. North Lebanon Township has its own Recycling Coordinator who is available to give a recycling presentation to your school, scouting, or civic organization within the Township. If interested, please contact the Township Office. Our Recycling Coordinator has the proper state required clearances and can make a presentation at a time suitable for your organization. You can help celebrate Earth Day every day! Below are a few ways you can make your home stormwater friendly and show your appreciation for our planet at the same time.

- $\Rightarrow$  Install a rain barrel
- $\Rightarrow$  Plant a tree
- $\Rightarrow$  Build a rain garden
- $\Rightarrow$  Switch to green cleaning products
- $\Rightarrow$  Reduce your use of pesticides and fertilizers
- $\Rightarrow$  Clean debris from areas surrounding stormwater drain
- $\Rightarrow$  Pick up after your pets and properly dispose of waste

## POLICE NEWS

On March 16<sup>th</sup> 2023, our police department will be conducting a Move Over Detail. This detail is being held to educate and enforce the Move Over Law to keep emergency responders and workers safe. This law requires motorist to move over and/or slow down when approaching and passing an emergency response area. The fine for the first offense is up to \$500.00.

Please be aware of scammers and do not provide any of your personal information over the phone. Recently unidentified people are calling our residents and identifying themselves as members of the Federal Trade Commission. This is a scam! Do NOT give them money.

Other scammers identify themselves as your local police advising you that you have a warrant out for your arrest for not responding to your subpoena. They request money to vacate the warrant. Do not meet anyone or send money to anyone involved in this scam. If you receive a call like this and are not sure if it is legitimate, give us a call. We will help you.

#### SLIP LINING STORMWATER PIPES

The Township will be contracting out some stormwater pipe relining. This process involves the insertion of a new "liner" into an existing pipe. Slip lining is more affordable, more durable, more efficient, easier to work with, and provides better water flow.

Slip lining can be done without the need to dig open the ground above which eliminates the need to fix damaged landscape and repave roadways.

The newly lined pipe can actually promote better water flow due to a smoother and more durable inner surface.

Some areas of the following streets are scheduled for stormwater pipe relining this year:

- ⇒ Kochenderfer Road
- ⇒ Sandhill Road
- $\Rightarrow$  Sycamore Lane
- ⇒ Poplar Lane
- $\Rightarrow$  Cypress Lane
- ⇒ Redwood Lane

We will also be slip lining several pipes that are not within the streets in this same area of the township. These areas are located within our storm sewer easements and are mostly situated on the boundary line between two properties or along rear property lines.

If you live in this area and wish to see the areas being relined please feel free to stop in the Twp. Office to view the map.
