PROJECTS THIS SUMMER

The Township will be paving the following roads this summer:

Alpha, Beta, Cappa, & Sholly Avenue Greenwood & Parkway Drive Willow, Maple, Oak, & Sycamore Lane

Some preliminary work will be done prior to the start of paving.

Be aware that line striping will occur later this summer. Do not drive over wet paint, as this may impact your vehicle. Paint removal from your vehicle is at YOUR cost.

Verizon is in the process of installing FiOS throughout various areas of the Township within the right-of-way.

Expect delays, especially during peak travel times. We are asking everyone to please observe signs, flaggers, and workers on the road.

Stay alert and drive with caution. Help keep our workers safe!



Please be Cautious of Township Workers

Mowing equipment will be moving throughout the Township. Please use caution while traveling and do NOT attempt to approach the equipment as it could result in a serious accident.

Please remember, if you are having mulch delivered it MUST be "dumped" on your property and NOT within the street or road right-of-way.



ORDINANCE 1-2013 SOLICITATION/PEDDLING REQUIREMENTS

Ordinance 1-2013 pertains to the Solicitation/ Peddling requirements within North Lebanon Township. Some highlights from the ordinance are:

- A license/permit must be obtained from NLT Police Dept. and should be worn by salesperson as proof of identification.
- Solicitation is permitted between the hours of 9:00am & sunset Monday thru Saturday.
- NO Solicitation is permitted on Sunday and Holidays.
- If anyone does not have ID or they look suspicious, contact the North Lebanon Police Dept.
- All non-profit groups are exempt.

PA One Call System

Know what's below. Dial 8—1—1 before you dig or call 1-800-242-1776. You can also visit their website at www.paonecall.org and submit your request online. There is NO fee to the property owner for this service. You may think you know where all underground utilities are located. It is better to be safe rather than sorry.

FLUSHABLE WIPES CLOG PIPES!

Disposable DOESN'T mean flushable. Please place disposable wipes (baby wipes, wet wipes, etc.); as well as sanitary products (tampons, pads, etc.), diapers, paper towels, cigarettes, etc. in the TRASH and NOT the toilet.

Only human waste and toilet paper should be flushed down the toilet.





FOG (<u>Fats</u>, <u>Oils</u>, and <u>Grease</u>)

Significant sources of FOG include: cooking fats, food scraps, sauces, salad dressings, mayonnaise, and lard and butter.

A few tips when it comes to FOG:

- Pour cooking oil into covered containers and dispose of with the garbage.
- Place food scraps into the garbage.
- * Wipe dishes free of FOG with a paper towel and toss in the trash.
- Clean grease spills with absorbent materials then dispose of in the trash.
- NEVER pour FOG down the drain.
- * NEVER discard food scraps down the sink.
- NEVER run hot water over greasy dishes.

The Township and the Police Dept. both have a 24 hour exterior drop off box. The phone number for county dispatch is listed on the Police Dept. door for after hour office needs:

SEWER BILLING

You should have already received your May sewer bill in the mail. If you did not receive your bill, please call the Township Office for your balance.

To avoid penalty, all payments <u>must be</u> <u>received</u> by Due Date. It is the customer's responsibility to insure receipt of the sewer invoice.

You may place your payment in the 24-hour drop box located in the front of our building just to the right of the main doors.

You can send your payment in the mail. If you are mailing your payment, please allow <u>plenty</u> of time for the mail to arrive in our office.

You may also pay your bill online using the sewer payment portal located on our website's home page (www.northlebanontwppa.gov). Any payments made online must be paid by midnight on June 10th to be considered "on time".

Your check must be in a cashable state, meaning your check must be signed, filled in correctly, and there must be sufficient funds in the account. If any of these things are not correct, the penalty process will begin.

We continue to receive checks where the digit amount does not match the written amount. It is the bank's legal position to accept the amount written out. If this happens you may incur late fees and penalties. It is your responsibility to insure your check is in a "cashable" state and is made out in the correct amount due.

Our policy states that late fees **WILL NOT** be waived.

You receive a quarterly invoice from the <u>North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority</u> for your sewer usage. This bill is for your **sewer usage** as well as operation and maintenance of the sewer system.

If you are connected to <u>public water</u>, you will also receive a separate bill from the <u>City of Lebanon Authority</u> for your **water consumption**.

Please be aware that these are two separate entities at two different locations.

Curb and Sidewalk Ordinance 1-2023

In January, the Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 1-2023 emulating an <u>existing</u> statute under the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code. This statute authorizes the Board of Supervisors to govern the construction, repairing, or re-laying of curb and sidewalk, township inspections, and responsibility for repair of damaged curb and sidewalk. The Ordinance adopted by the Board also sets forth regulations for snow and ice removal as well as vegetation maintenance on existing sidewalks. The ordinance specifically establishes regulations for constructing, repairing, and replacing curbs and sidewalks, and specifies the type and manner of notice that North Lebanon Township is required to provide to the property owner.

As stated by the Board of Supervisors during the public hearing, it is <u>not</u> the intent of this ordinance to mandate the installation of new curbing and or sidewalk in areas of the township where they currently do not exist, except as may be required in new developments by the Lebanon County Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO). There are no plans, now or in the foreseeable future, to require comprehensive curb and sidewalk installations throughout the township or in any one area of the township.

At the public hearing held on January 16, 2023, the Board confirmed their primary intention of adopting the ordinance was to establish the notification procedure when it is determined that certain curbs or sidewalks are deficient and need repairs ahead of a paving project.

We are hopeful that the above explanation will provide you with the correct information shared with the public during the public hearing regarding the intent of this ordinance. This information was also reiterated at the April 17, 2023, board meeting, as we recognize that there are questions about the reason for this ordinance.

Preventing Stormwater Runoff Pollution

- Only allow rain water to enter the storm drains and inlets.
- NO leaves, NO grass, NO trash in the inlet.
- It is illegal to allow grass clippings in the street.
- NEVER dump anything into storm drains or streams.
- Pick up after your pet.
- Check your car for leaks and recycle your oil.
- Wash your vehicles at a local car wash instead of in your driveway. This will help keep harmful detergents and soaps from entering streams.

Report any spills or suspicious dumping to County Dispatch at 717-272-2054.

MOWING - A reminder to our residents, when mowing your lawn <u>please</u> **DO NOT BLOW grass clippings into the street.** This allows the grass clippings to get into nearby storm water inlets or trenches. **Not only is it illegal as per Township Ordinances**, such activity encourages the growth of algae in local streams which depletes the oxygen in the water and impacts fish and other aquatic species. If you

choose not to leave your clippings on your lawn, compost them or bring them to the Township Yard Waste Facility. The Yard Waste Facility fee is \$50 per calendar year.

TREE DEDICATION

Consider adopting a tree in memory of a loved one. We have trees available at Lenni Lenape and at the Township Community Park. We recently added additional shade trees surrounding the playground and pavilion area at Lenni Lenape. There are many varieties available for

you to choose from. The cost is \$300 per tree. You can also purchase a plaque from our preapproved designs which we will install free of charge.





Benches and disc golf sponsorships are also available if you are looking to promote your business.

FIREWORKS

You must be 18 years old to set off fireworks. They cannot be ignited or discharged on a public road or someone's private property without their permission.

YOU MUST BE AT LEAST 150 FEET FROM ANY OCCUPIED STRUCTURE.

You may not be under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance while handling fireworks.

If you are found to be in violation of the PA Fireworks Law, it is a punishable offense.

Only **fireworks** sold by local venders are legal for display. **Use of illegal fireworks will be strictly enforced.**



PAVILION RENTALS

Are you planning a family reunion? What about a group picnic? North Lebanon has several pavilions available for rent to hold your function. It is a great opportunity to get together and enjoy the outdoors. We have playgrounds, walking paths, full service pavilions with kitchen amenities, open air pavilions and bathroom

facilities. Please be reminded that <u>all pavilions</u> require a rental agreement with the Township.

Battery Recycling

Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority (GLRA) has been approved as a Call2Recycle collection site. Residents can recycle all rechargeable and single use batteries for FREE at GLRA's Electronics Recycling Facility, located at 1805 Russell Road.

Each individual battery must be under 11 pounds and placed individually in a clear plastic storage / Ziploc bag. Bags are available at the E-Waste Facility. Batteries may hold a residual charge even when they appear dead. When a battery comes into contact with other batteries or metal, a spark or heat can occur and cause a fire or explosion. Bagging the batteries individually is the quickest and easiest way to protect battery terminals.
