# Fall Clean Up will begin October 16, 2023

Only **ONE** collection sweep of the Township will be made. Please have all items curbside by October 16th at 6:00 a.m.

Once collection has been made, there will be NO return trips.

### ACCEPTABLE ITEMS for collection are BRANCHES, STICKS AND TWIGS Only these items will be collected

- All branches must be cut to **6 foot in length** or smaller and **be less than 6 inches in diameter** 

- Place in neat 6 foot to 8 foot long piles

and **as high as 4 feet** along the curb

- Please place piles parallel to the curb

# UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS which WILL NOT BE COLLECTED are as follows:

- Non-wood items
- NO root systems, grass clippings, or mulch
- NO sod of any kind
- NO chemically treated products
- NO furniture of any type

Any unacceptable items will be left on the property and will be the owners' responsibility to discard.



A SUGGESTION FROM THE ROADMASTER – If you and your neighbor have small piles, please consider <u>combining your piles into one larger pile</u> (like the photo to the left) to make it easier for the road crew to pick up. Please keep piles away from obstructions such as poles, mailboxes, cars, etc.

### SCHOOL BUS SAFETY — Let's keep our children safe!

Our schools will be opening soon and school buses will be transporting our children to and from school. The Pennsylvania Vehicle Code prohibits passing a school bus when its red lights have been activated and the side stop sign is being displayed. It further requires the driver of a motor vehicle to stop at least 10 feet from a school bus taking on or discharging children. The driver of a vehicle must remain stopped as long as the red signal lights are flashing and the side stop signal arms are activated. The penalty for violating and failing to comply with the requirements of a driver when approaching a school bus with its red signal lights flashing and the side stop signal arms are activated is:

- $\Rightarrow$  A fine of \$250.00 plus costs
- ⇒ Loss of driving privileges for 60 days
- $\Rightarrow$  5 points

# FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Township Road Crew will begin leaf collection on OCTOBER 23 and end on DECEMBER 15, 2023 \*\*



OR will cease on the first measurable snowfall, whichever comes first.

NO COLLECTION ON - Nov. 7th, Nov. 10th, and Nov. 23rd

**Please:** rake leaves out 2 feet away from curbing or to within 6" of roadside. Leaves to be collected should be placed away from mailboxes, cars, and other objects to allow space for equipment to operate. Be aware that collection **is for leaves ONLY.** Any other debris or items will damage the equipment and **WILL NOT** be collected.

**Do Not:** place sticks, twigs, ornamental grass, or any other items in leaf pile. Do not park vehicles on top or near piles to be collected, and please do not bag leaves.

NOTE: There will be a sweep of the entire Township every week. If you do not have your leaves out when the truck passes, leaves will be picked up the following week or can be brought to the NLT Yard Waste Facility.

\*\*In the event of inclement weather leaf collection may be postponed. NLT's road crew would like to complete leaf collection prior to the arrival of winter weather. PLEASE PUT YOUR LEAVES OUT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE!

### **Online Sewer Payments**

If you choose to pay your sewer bill online, we recommend using the link directly from our website at **www.northlebanontwppa.gov**. Utilizing the customer portal on our website will ensure that your payment is received immediately by our system which credits your account the same day. Your bank, as well as 3rd party sites, allow you to pay online through their company; they then send us a paper check which can take up to THREE WEEKS for our office to receive. **Please be aware when using your bank or a 3rd party site, if your payment arrives late it will be considered late**. You must allow plenty of extra time for their check to reach us by the due date. The only way to be absolutely positive your bill is received on time when paying online is to **use the direct customer portal from our website**. Sewer bills will go out on November 10th and will be due on December 10th. Any payment made on-line must be paid by midnight on December 10th **using the link on our website**.

#### SEWER BILLING DATES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

February 10	August 10
May 10	November 10

If you do not receive a bill by the end of these months please call the Township Office at 717-273-7132 for your balance. It is the customer's responsibility to insure receipt of the sewer invoice. We CANNOT waive late fees.

A reminder—In order for a payment to be considered "on time" it must be **in our office by the close of business (4:00 pm) on the due date**. Checks must be in a cashable state. The Authority's Payment Policy DOES NOT allow for forgiveness of any late fees. There will be no exceptions to this policy. If you have any questions, the complete payment policy is on our website.

After 4:00 PM, your call will automatically be forwarded to County Dispatch. However, we have Officers on patrol 24/7.

### Additional Parking and Walking Path

#### <u>at Lenni Lenape</u>

Additional paved parking at Lenni Lenape was completed earlier this year.

We also applied for, and were awarded, the Marcellus Shale Grant from the County to help fund the final phase of the walking path as shown here

shown h in red.

The project will be completed this fall.



### WATER DEBT/LOAN

The water project was installed in the eastern area of the township in 2005. The original bond was in the amount of \$3,374,500.00 with payments going through 2035.

In 2016 the bonds were refinanced in the amount of \$2,197,000.00 to a traditional bank loan.

At the end of 2020, we renegotiated the terms of the water loan to a 1.60% interest rate through 2027 and then it will increase to a variable rate between 2.75% to 4.25% for the remainder of the loan. By converting to monthly payments, reducing the interest rate, and making extra payments on the principal, the loan is currently scheduled to be paid off in August of 2030.

# The current balance as of 8/15/23 is \$687,435.15.

The quarterly customer charge of \$60 all goes towards paying down the debt, which is part of our water operating expenses. Only those customers who are within the water project area pay this fee. The fee shows up on the residents' water bill from the City of Lebanon Authority, who collects the fee and then forwards the money monthly to us.

Extra payments are made from the tapping fees paid for new connections.

### SEWER DEBT/LOAN

In 2016 the bonds were refinanced in the amount of \$8,818,000.00 from municipal bonds to a traditional bank loan. We also reduced the interest rate to 2.33% until 2022 which would then increase to 4.25% for the remainder of the loan which was 2029.

At the end of 2020 we renegotiated the terms of the sewer loan to a 2.04% interest rate for the duration of the loan. By converting to monthly payments, decreasing the interest rate, and making extra payments on principal, the loan is currently scheduled to be paid off in July of 2025.

# The current balance as of 8/15/23 is \$740,992.04.

The quarterly <u>customer charge of \$78</u> is primarily used for daily operation and maintenance of our sewer system and a small portion goes towards paying down the debt.

The <u>water usage fee</u> is simply a pass-through fee that goes to the City of Lebanon Authority to treat the sewage flows. They set the fees and bill the Township and we in turn pass the fee on to the customer.

Extra payments are made from the tapping fees paid for new connections.

# **On-Lot Sewage Management Program Update**

The North Lebanon Township Sewage Management Ordinance requires that every property owner who has an on-lot sewage disposal system have their treatment/septic tank(s) pumped once every three (3) years within the year the municipality is due.

- → Notices were sent out on April 3rd to all North Lebanon Township residents with on-lot systems
- $\rightarrow$  A second notice was mailed out on July 17th as a friendly reminder of the approaching due date
- $\rightarrow$  The due date is August 31st
- → You must use a registered pumper/hauler from the list you received with the original mailing

→ Currently, there is a thirty dollar (\$30) administrative fee per lot, payable to **North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority.** Please mail all report forms to North Lebanon Township and make all checks payable to **North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority.** You can find frequently asked questions and some of our forms on our website at <u>www.northlebanontwppa.gov</u>.

Anyone desiring an exemption from the assigned pumping cycle must request an exemption form from the North Lebanon Township Office. There are <u>three ways to Qualify for an Exemption from the</u> <u>Current Pumping Cycle</u>:

1. Have a qualified inspector evaluate the depth of the solids and scum in the tank. If the total depth of both solids and scum is less than 1/3 full, you would qualify for an exemption. The proper paperwork and fee must accompany this request.

2. If you had your tank pumped within the last year, you can submit the report form and the fee and we will accept that pumping.

3. If you had your sewage system newly built or repaired within the last year you may qualify for an exemption. You must submit a copy of the approved sewage permit and final inspection along with the exemption request form and the administration fee. We will review the request and determine if the type of repair qualifies for an exemption.
