

Approval Process

1. Call the Township Office to request a meeting with Molly Lum (Asst. Manager) and Dave Leid (Parks & Recreation Foreman).
2. Meet with Molly & Dave to discuss your project ideas and specific park needs.
3. Submit a draft of the proposed project to the Assistant Manager for review.
4. Once the proposal is approved by Township staff, the scout must present the project to the Parks & Recreation Board at one of their regularly scheduled meetings (1st Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m.).
5. Once your project has been approved by your scout leaders, a follow-up meeting must be scheduled with the Parks & Recreation Foreman to address project start dates and final coordination with Township personnel.
6. Once your project is complete, provide the Court of Honor date, time and location to the Assistant Manager and Parks & Recreation Foreman. A Certificate of Appreciation and Recognition will be presented by the Board of Supervisors to the scout at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors (3rd Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m.).

General Information

- ⇒ A building permit may be required for certain construction projects.
- ⇒ If you are auguring holes, you must call 8-1-1 before you dig and notify the Township at least 5 days prior.
- ⇒ Request delivery of any equipment and supplies needed from the Township at least one month prior.
