The fees above include proper signage set up by the Authority (Terra Cotta pipe installations are performed by the City of Lebanon Authority). In all cases, the applicant is responsible for digging to the main and exposing the pipe so that the Authority employee can make the installation. Proper shoring must be in place at approximately 36" deep, or if the Authority employee requires otherwise for safety measures. The applicant will be held responsible for any costs above the required saddle/inserta tee fee. If a pump or steel plates are required, the Authority personnel will transport the pump; however, the Developer must take the steel plate to the site.

SEWER TREATMENT RATES

"North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority Sewer System" customers shall pay the sewer treatment rates adopted by the City of Lebanon Authority. The consumption charges are based on measured water usage on a per thousand gallon basis.

"North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority Sewer System" non-metered single-family residential sewer customers who are serviced by well water with no meter installed, and are connected to the "NLTMA Sewer System" shall be charged at the rate of: 15,000 gallons per quarter for sewer treatment.

"North Lebanon Township Municipal Authority Sewer System" multiple residential dwellings will be billed accordingly.

Note: High consumption sewer customers as determined by the City of Lebanon Authority shall be billed on a monthly basis. Well gallons are determined by the City of Lebanon Authority.

SEWER TREATMENT RATES - ADDITIONAL CHARGES

All NLTMA sewer customers will be charged the quarterly user rate fee, plus any usage that is billed from the City of Lebanon Authority. The usage charges will be reflected on the NLTMA sewer bill. Any additional charges imposed by the City of Lebanon Authority will be charged to NLTMA customers.

D. DEP Exemption Guidelines for Public Sewer

- I. Any subdivision or land development plans that are serviced by public sewer may be exempt from submitting a Component 3 Planning Module, per DEP, under the following conditions:
 - a. Less than 250 EDU's in the development
 - b. No public pump stations or force mains are needed
 - c. Gravity sewer sizes will generally not exceed 8" in diameter
 - d. The project will not cause a Chapter 94 overload of the collection system for 5 years from the date of application

Note: If any of the above conditions cannot be met, a Component 3 Planning Module will be required to be processed.

E. Planning Module Exemption Request Procedure (public sewer only)

- The following must be submitted for approval of a planning module that meets the above stated DEP exemption criteria. Please submit 4 complete packets of:
 - a. The DEP postcard mailer application (to be signed by designated municipal official).

^{*}Acreage of tract for newly developed lot or disturbed acreage undergoing review.

- Narrative describing the development, proposed method of sewage disposal, alternative disposal method, and identifying the point of sewer connection.
- c. USGS topo map
- d. PNDI receipt and any clearance letters from any agency that had potential conflicts
- e. Written certification from NLTMA stating there is ample capacity for collection and conveyance within their system for this development and this request will not create a hydraulic or an organic overload over the next 5 years.
- f. Written certification from City of Lebanon Authority (CoLA) stating there is ample capacity for conveyance and treatment at the sewage treatment plant for this development and this request will not create a hydraulic or an organic overload over the next 5-years
- g. Written confirmation from CoLA stating they have capacity to service the project with public water
- h. Plot plan

F. Designated Municipal Official

I. The Township Manager or Chairman of the Board of Supervisors shall be designated as the municipal official who shall sign the postcard mailer and return to DEP/DLA.

G. Components

- I. Component 1 on-lot, single-family dwellings (10 lots or less)
- II. Component 2 on-lot, 10+ lots, Preliminary Hydrogeological Study for on-lot systems or commercial
- III. Component 3 public sewer

TAPPING FEES

A. Sewer Treatment Capacity and Tapping Fees

Each owner shall be required to first purchase sewer treatment capacity at the CoLA Treatment Plant by making application to the NLTMA and paying the sewer treatment capacity fee and the NLTMA tapping fee. The number of EDU's required to be purchased shall be according to the EDU chart that is adopted by the NLTMA Board, or in special cases, by agreement. The sewer treatment capacity fee may change at the discretion of CoLA and the owner will be charged accordingly. No sewer treatment capacity shall be guaranteed until such time as sewer treatment capacity at the CoLA Treatment Plant is granted. The NLTMA tapping fee is calculated by the Authority Engineer as set forth in Resolution 02-2005. This is for collection and capacity within NLTMA's lines.

NLTMA will monitor the usage for a period of one year. If at the end of that year the data shows that the customer is using more EDU's than purchased, the customer will have the opportunity to reduce the usage within the next 12 months, or the customer will be required to purchase additional sewer treatment capacity and tapping fees per EDU.

The capacity fee for sewer treatment shall be paid prior to final plan approval. The tapping fee shall be paid at the time of application for the sewer permit.

C. Special Purpose Tapping Fee I (Water Street)

This tapping fee shall be applicable only to those sewer customers who connect to the "NLTMA Sewer System" within the area as outlined in Table WS-4 included in Resolution 05-2000. This shall be paid at the time of application for the sewer permit.

E. Special Purpose Tapping Fee IV (N 8th Avenue)

This tapping fee shall be applicable only to those sewer customers who connect to the "NLTMA Sewer System" within the area as outlined in the map included in Resolution 01-2004. This shall be paid at the time of application for the sewer permit.

F. Special Purpose Tapping Fee VI (Business Park)

\$20,400 per lot

This tapping fee shall be applicable to the two lots on Windsor Drive (GIS # 27-2324837-371691 & 27-2324588-370995) that will connect to the business park line installed by NLTMA. This shall be paid at the time of application for the sewer permit.

G. Reimbursement

The Developer shall be entitled to reimbursement under the Municipality Authorities Act from any future connections made within ten (10) years outside of the development to any sewer and water (Township water service area only) line constructed by the Developer at his expense and subsequently dedicated to the Authority. The Authority and Developer shall enter into a Reimbursement Agreement in accordance with Section 5607(d)(31) of the Pennsylvania Municipality Authorities Act.
